We believe that education, including education for tribal, ethnic, and religious leaders and actors, as well as youth, increase mutual respect; tolerance, and understanding while diminishing the risk that individuals could be manipulated for political purposes. We don't give aid; we strive for dialogue and tolerance, empowering communities to stand up for peace.

PROGRAM ACTIVITIES OF THE ORGANIZATION



Celebration of the International Day Commemorating the Victims of Acts of Violence Based on Religion or Belief

FIIDI joined like-minded organizations around the globe to celebrate the International Day Commemorating the Victims of Acts of Violence Based on Religion or Belief by organizing a Community Outreach Workshop at the Makomp Community Hall on Sunday, 22 August 2021. The celebration of the Day was an opportunity to engage religious leaders and community members especially the youth to promote a culture of Interfaith and Intercultural Dialogue. The main topics lay focus on the dimension of faith and local contexts like peacebuilding and interfaith dialogue according to Islam and Christianity as well as discussions about young people and religious violence in Africa. The workshop brought together 70 participants who were mostly youth from the communities of Makomp, Mabesseneh, Royama, Malompoh, and Lunsar Town.

COVID-19 Awareness Campaign

In 2021, FIIDI incorporated COVID-19 awareness messages in all its activities targeting vulnerable and disadvantaged groups in the communities with the aim of combatting the challenges caused by the pandemic during the year. FIIDI sensitized the people of Makomp, Mabesseneh and Faredugu about COVID-19 and measures to be undertaken by all to prevent the spread of the pandemic. Awareness creation in the communities was undertaken by the Port Loko District Council in July 2021.



Community Circles for Interfaith Dialogue Project



The Covid-19 pandemic has been accompanied by a surge in stigma, discrimination, and hatred, which only cost more lives instead of saving them. The virus attacks all without caring aboutwhere we are from or what we believe in? To be able to recover from the devastation of the pandemic, we must make peace with one another. Therefore, as the United Nations invited all nations and people to celebrate the International Day of Peace with a focus (theme) on "Recovering better for an equitable and sustainable world"; FIIDI launched its Community Circles for Interfaith Dialogue Project on Tuesday, 21September 2021 during the well-known Luma in the Faredugu community of the Boya Romende Chiefdom in the Karena District of Sierra Leone. The goal of the project is to foster peace and engagement and understanding in the community, by the community and for the community through Drama. This project has also benefited the people of Mabesseneh, and Makomp of the Marampa Chiefdom in the Port Loko District.

Looking into the near future, FIIDI aims to build partnerships with like-minded individuals and organizations in Sierra Leone and around the world to foster understanding, tolerance, and acceptance in the communities we serve.
